

In the summertime she enjoyed exploring the woods, and today she was heading out on a quest!












#### She crawled over and under logs,

But it was too late. Birch was flying off again, eager as ever.








Avery thought quickly, and before she could think twice, she jumped!

Birch took the nearest leaf and tucked it's spiky underside away.








Then she showed Avery how to carefully cut it off its stem.

Then Avery tipped the bottle and took a sip of the enchanted potion.










She would think it was all a dream, if it weren't for the small basket of huckleberries she found lying next to her.
